One Author's Last Name, First Name. Book Title.

Publisher Name, copyright date.

Three Authors Payne, Roger, Susan Bass, and John Hays.

Date of publication, section, page#s.

pp. 3-5.

WEBSITE Author last , first name. "Title of article." Website Name, editor (if there is one),

date of article, URL. Accessed date.

Name of website, date website was created or last updated, URL. Accessed

date.
