Community

The School District of Upper Moreland Township is located in Montgomery County approximately fifteen miles north of Center City Philadelphia. The major portion of the Township is now developed and is primarily zoned for residential use. The area served by the district has a population of approximately 24,163 residents.

School

Upper Moreland High School is a four year comprehensive high school with the 2019-2020 enrollment being 937 students. The total number of faculty at the high school is 76.

Curriculum

The comprehensive curriculum includes several instructional levels (AP, Honors, College Prep) for core academic courses as well as a range of elective offerings. Students may also attend the Eastern Center for Arts and Technology to pursue focused career training in lieu of the regular elective program. Students are also able to attend classes at Montgomery County Community College on a dual enrollment status or the 2+1+2 credit earning program.

Graduation Requirements

Students must earn a minimum of 28 credits in grades 9-12 to be diploma eligible. Credits must be earned in the following subjects: English (4), (7) credits Math & Science (minimum 3 credits each) Social Studies (4), Physical Education (2), Health (1), Electives (7.5), Personal Finance (.5), World Language (2).

Rank in Class

All students in the class are included. Ranking is cumulative for grades 9-12. All courses are included in the ranking process, which is based on the final weighted GPA. Grades earned in Honors and AP courses represent a higher level of achievement and are assigned additional weight as noted in the grading system.
